Defense mechanism



Personality defines as: a person's unique and relatively stable behavior patterns; the consistency of who you are, have been, and will become.

A sudden change in personality indicates a psychological problem.

Personality Structure according to Freud



- ■Id(الہوا): Operates according to the pleasure principle Primitive and unconscious, hidden from view Contains basic drives (the infant is a total Id).
 -Id is the instinct part of your personality, and it operates based on fixed behavior patterns. We can't rely only on Id.
- Ego(الأنا): Operates according to the reality principle

 Mediates the conflict between id and superego.
- -Ego is rational and close to reality.

We should be running on ego as it moves freely between Id and Superego based on our needs.

- Superego(الأنا الأعلى): Consists of moral ideals and conscience.
- -Superego is your morality and ethics which dictates how you act in certain situations.

We can't rely only on superego in our lives as we all make mistakes and our guilt towards any wrongdoing will be destructive.

Freud's Topographical Models of Personality

Freud classified all mental contents and operations into three categories: the conscious, the preconscious, and the unconscious.

• The conscious includes all memories that remain within an individual's awareness. Examples include telephone numbers, birthdays of self and significant others, dates of special holidays, and what one had for lunch today. The conscious mind is thought to be under the control of the ego, the rational and logical structure of the personality.

-We retrieve our memories in the conscious without effort or attention.

The preconscious includes all memories that may have been forgotten or are not in present awareness but, with attention, can readily be recalled into consciousness. Examples include telephone numbers or addresses once known but little used and feelings associated with significant life events that may have occurred at some time in the past.

The preconscious enhances awareness by helping to suppress unpleasant or nonessential memories from consciousness. It is thought to be partially under the control of the superego, which helps to suppress unacceptable thoughts and behaviours.

• The unconscious: includes all memories that one is unable to bring to conscious awareness. It is the largest of the three topographical levels. Unconscious material consists of unpleasant or nonessential memories that have been repressed and can be retrieved only through therapy, hypnosis, and with certain substances that alter the awareness and have the capacity to restructure repressed memories.

Unconscious material may also emerge in dreams and in seemingly incomprehensible behaviour.

-This is where we repress painful memories and unpleasant feelings. The doctor had an analogy for the conscious, the preconscious, and the unconscious.

EGO SUPEREGO ID

Imagine that you are on a ship, and there is an iceberg in the middle of the ocean. The conscious would be the apparent top part of the iceberg that is easily definable and avoidable by your ship. The preconscious is the under sea part that is close to the surface and with a little focus and attention can be determinable. It is not as effortless to avoid as the top of the iceberg, but it still can be avoidable. The unconscious is the hidden indeterminable part that lies deep within the ocean. It is easy to hit that part.

Our personalities and egos are examined by stressful and anxiety-full situations. If our ego mediated between the Id and Superego well enough, then our ego is good.

Sigmund Freud (1961) identified the ego as the reality component of the personality that governs problem solving and rational thinking.

- As the level of anxiety increases, the strength of the ego is tested, and energy is mobilized to confront the threat.
- Freud (1953) identified a number of defense mechanisms employed by the ego in the face of threat to biological or psychological integrity.

Definition of defense mechanism

Defense mechanism are mental activities used at the unconscious level to protect the ego <u>against anxiety and conflict situation.</u>

- Some of these ego defense mechanisms are more adaptive than others are, but all are used either consciously or unconsciously as protective devices for the ego in an effort to relieve mild to moderate anxiety.
- They become <u>maladaptive</u> when an individual uses them to such a degree that there is interference with the <u>ability to deal with reality</u>, with interpersonal relations, or with occupational

Functions of Defense Mechanisms

- 1- Facilitates the resolution of emotional conflict.
- 2- To provide relief from stress.
- 3-To cushion emotional pain.
- 4-To avoid or alleviate anxiety.



Defense Mechanism

Example

Compensation

Covering up a real or perceived weakness by emphasizing a trait one considers more desirable

Example

Attributing feelings or impulses unacceptable to one's self to another person. Sue feels a strong sexual attraction to her track coach and tells her friend, "He's coming on to me!"

Rationalization

Attempting to make excuses or formulate logical reasons to justify unacceptable feelings or behaviors

التبرير

John tells the rehab nurse, "I drink because it's the only way I can deal with my bad marriage and my worse job."

Denial

Refusing to acknowledge the existence of a real situation or the feelings associated with it

A woman drinks excess alcohol every day and cannot stop, failing to acknowledge that she has a problem.

Displacement

The transfer of feelings from one target to another that is considered less threatening or that is neutral

Reaction Formation

reaction formation:

Preventing unacceptable or undesirable thoughts or behaviors from being expressed by exaggerating opposite thoughts or types of behaviors Jane hates nursing. She attended nursing school to please her parents. During career day, she speaks to prospective students about the excellence of nursing as a career.

Identification

An attempt to increase selfworth by acquiring certain attributes and characteristics of an individual one admires

Regression

Responding to stress by retreating to an earlier level of development and the comfort measures associated with that level of functioning

Intellectualization

An attempt to avoid expressing actual emotions associated with a stressful situation by using the intellectual processes of logic, reasoning, and analysis

Integrating the beliefs and values of another individual into one's own ego structure

Repression

Involuntarily blocking unpleasant feelings and experiences from one's awareness

involuntary blocking

Sublimation

Rechanneling of drives or impulses that are personally or socially unacceptable into activities that are constructive

Isolation

Separating a thought or memory from the feeling tone or emotion associated with it

Suppression

The voluntary blocking of unpleasant feelings and experiences from one's awareness

Undoing

Symbolically negating or canceling out an experience that one finds intolerable



Substitution:(الاستبدال) The replacement of consciously unacceptable emotions, drives, attitudes, or needs by those that are more acceptable. Example 1-a student nurse in a degree program who feels unable to master the clinical competence decided to become a respiratory technician.

Example 2:I am not good at football so I will try the swim team."

Conversion : (التحويل) the transferring of a mental conflict into physical symptoms to release tension or anxiety.

Example1: a man develops paralysis of his lower extremities after he find out that his wife has a terminal cancer. Example 2: a student develops paralysis of right arm when she faced difficult exam.

emotionally charged conflict from one's consciousness. This detached information is blocked from conscious awareness, which allows the person to defer or postpone experiencing an emotional impact or painful feelings. Example: a woman who was raped was found wandering in a busy highway in torn clothing. When examined by the doctor, the woman was exhibiting symptoms of traumatic amnesia. She separated and detached her emotional reaction to the rape from her consciousness.

Traumatic amnesia as a result of emotional pain.it is to separate that experience from memory and to forget it

Fantasy: imagined events or mental images (daydreaming) to express unconscious conflicts, gratify unconscious wishes, or prepare for anticipated events.

Example: I love animals so much, so even if I fail Biology I can still be a veterinarian.



Important facts should be remembered: Ego defenses are not necessarily unhealthy as you can see by the examples above. In fact,

- 1-The lack of these defenses or the inability to use them effectively can often lead to problems in life.
- 2- Employ the defenses at the wrong time leads to deviation from mental health.
- 3- Overuse defenses, which can be equally destructive.
