

Respiratory System (RS) Physical Examination Checklist

Opening the Examination (Score: 1/10)

- 1. Introduction: Introduce yourself and your role.
- 2. Consent: Explain the purpose of the examination and obtain consent.
- 3. **Positioning & Privacy & Lightning**: Ensure the patient is comfortably positioned, at a 45-<u>degree angle</u>.

General Inspection (Score: 1/10) + Posterior Chest Wall

- 4. **General Appearance**: Observe the patient's general appearance and any signs of respiratory distress (As Tripod Position or use of accessory muscles).
- 5. Hands and Nails: Inspect for clubbing, cyanosis, and nicotine staining.
- 6. **Face**: Look for signs of central cyanosis.
- 7. Chest: Inspect the chest for deformities, scars, and asymmetry.

Palpation (Score: 2/10) + Posterior Chest Wall

- 8. Tracheal Position: Check for tracheal deviation.
- 9. **Chest Expansion**: Assess chest expansion by placing hands on the patient's chest and asking them to take a deep breath. (1P)
- 10. **Tactile Fremitus**: Palpate for tactile fremitus by asking the patient to say "99" while feeling for vibrations.

Percussion (Score: 2/10) + Posterior Chest Wall

11. General Percussion: Percuss all areas of the chest to assess for resonance.

Auscultation (Score: 3/10) + Posterior Chest Wall

- 13. Breath Sounds: Listen to breath sounds in all lung fields.
- 14. **Adventitious Sounds**: Identify any adventitious sounds like wheezes, crackles, or pleural rubs.
- 15. **Vocal Resonance**: Assess vocal resonance by asking the patient to say "99" while auscultating.

Special Tests (Score: 1/10)

16. **Egophony**: Ask the patient to say "ee" and listen for a change to "ay" sound.

Closing the Examination (Score: 1/10)

19. Thank You & Cover the patient: Thank the patient for their time and cooperation.
