





* Infections of paranasal sinuses & ears




* Infections of the throat




Community-acquired pneumonia CAP




* Pneumonia (Lung infection)


Atypical pneumonia




Hospital-acquired pneumonia (Nosocomial)




Pneumonia following influenzae





Pneumonia in patients with chronic lung diseases

General Remarks

- Antimicrobials are prescribed only if there is high suspicion of bacterial RTI e.g. purulent sputum
- A responsible "best guess" is started with according to possible organisms & diagnosis
- When results of specimen are known, then treatment is adjusted accordingly
