


Summary of LEC 20 - Anatomy

Compartment Of Leg (3 compartment)



Anterior

4 muscles

group A + group B bony bridge

***Tibialis Anterior**

Extensor Digitorum Longus

***Fibularis Tertius**

Extensor Hallucis Longus

- The function?

1. Dorsiflex and Invert the foot
at the ankle joint GCA+B

2. group B extend the toes

• Muscles of Anterior Compartment
are innervated by Deep fibular nerve

• Blood is supplied via Anterior tibial artery.

Lateral

2 muscles

peroneal (fibularis) Longus
peroneal (fibularis) brevis

- The function?

1. eversion \Rightarrow Sole of the foot outwards

2. fix the medial margin of the foot
during running and prevent excessive inversion

*The posterior Largest
of the 3 compartment

innervated by \rightarrow Superficial fibular Nerve

- The function?

The all 7 muscles
plantarflex and Invert
the foot

innervated by \rightarrow Tibial nerve

(\hookrightarrow Terminal branch of the
Sciatic nerve)

7 muscles

Superficial Deep

* Between Superficial and
deep there is band of
fascia

↳ Calf shape
of the posterior leg

* The all posterior compartment of Leg are insert into the calcaneus via calcaneal tendon

Calf often exposed to friction, and the friction is reduced through? The two bursae (fluid filled sacs: deep) associated with the calcaneal tendon

One * Subcutaneous calcaneal bursa
(Between the skin and calcaneal tendon)

two * Deep bursa of calcaneal tendon
(Between the tendon and calcaneus)

3 * **Gastrocnemius**: The most superficial of the muscles in the posterior leg

→ has 2 heads - medial and lateral which converge to form a single muscle belly

الخلف

→ **Popliteus**: - Located superiorly in the leg
- behind the knee joint
- forming the base of popliteal fossa

→ **Tibialis posterior**:

- The deepest out of 4 muscles
- It lies between the flexor digitorum longus and flexor hallucis longus

→ **Flexor digitorum Longus (FDL)**
- FDL < FHL
- Located medially in the P.L

→ **Flexor Hallucis Longus (FHL)**
- Lateral side of Leg
